INTERNSHIP: INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN

The **Instructional Design** Intern will use *Adobe Captivate, Articulate Studio, Articulate Storyline*, or similar software to develop web-based, modular training materials for college/university professionals who work with students with autism. Working with subject-matter experts, the intern will initiate an ADDIE (Analysis, Design, Development, Implementation, and Evaluation) process to produce a public-ready "version 1.0" of the training platform during the Spring 2017 semester.

The intern may also have an opportunity to continue the internship through the Summer and/or Fall 2017 semesters to evaluate the curriculum's effectiveness, revise content and/or delivery, and extend the curriculum to other stakeholders. There will also be opportunities for the intern to participate in conference presentations and/or journal publications. Limited financial support for related conference travel is also possible.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Analysis: Clarify instructional goals; Assess audience skills/needs; Review content delivery options
- **Design:** Articulate and apply instructional, visual, and technical design strategies to create a prototype
- Develop: Collect and assemble content assets; Test and debug platform; Revise product using feedback
- Implement: Publicly launch the modular curriculum; Provide instructional & technical guidance to staff
- **Evaluate**: Review feedback to ensure scalability and accessibility to all types of learners

QUALIFICATIONS (Preferred)

The ideal candidates are well organized, tech savvy, and have an eye for detail.

- Experience and/or training related to curriculum design, professional development, or adult learning
- Experience and or training related to integrated assessment and program evaluation
- Experience and or training for Adobe Captivate, Articulate Studio, Articulate Storyline, or similar
- Ability to communicate effectively, both verbally and in writing, across multiple platforms/mediums
- Current college student or recent graduate in education, instructional design, learning systems, human resources, or other related fields. Master's Degree, EdD, and PhD students preferred

As a result of this internship, students will:

- Enhance technological competency with content delivery platforms
- Grow their professional portfolio to advance career prospects
- Build professional contacts through interactions with content experts from across the country
- Contribute to a new but rapidly growing organization dedicated to social improvement
- Gain an understanding in how a nonprofit organization operates

COMPENSATION, CREDIT, AND WORK CONDITIONS

This volunteer position may be eligible for internship, independent study, and/or institution-specific (e.g., Garnet & Gold) academic credit. The position requires approximately 10 hours/week, has flexible hours, and can be completed remotely as needed. Initial appointment is for one semester, though we are especially eager to work with interns who foresee potential year-long involvement.
